- 2 Continue the zero-tolerance campaign on sexual harassment and sexual assault by lobbying the University to implement the recommendations in our Simmie Safety report.
- **Lobby the University to record lectures by default** by pushing for the implementation of an "opt-out" lecture capture policy.
- 4 Improve access to resources and ensure issues accessing books and journal articles can be easily reported.
- Lobby for a maximum 48-hour response target to all student emails as all students deserve access to prompt advice, support, and guidance.





- 1 Improve awareness of wellbeing support in Student Services through more regular drop-in's, and promotion online and in person.
- 2 Introduce a designated contact for each course to support students with disabilities and wellbeing issues
