What is a Subject Chair?

Subject Chairs are current students, who are appointed to represent their overall School and Faculty

- Subject Chairs are a vital part of our representation structures and work closely with Course Reps, Academics, the Education President and University Senior Leadership to improve the quality of education, and overall student experience at St Mary's University.
- They actively participate in high profile meetings/committees to ensure student voice is heard at the highest level of university.
- They act as a key contact for Course Reps to help them elevate any concerns, and advise, support and signpost, where needed.



Expectations:

- Act as the lead student representative for their School and Faculty
- Collect and analyse feedback from Course Reps within their School and Faculty at Student/Staff Forums and pass on to the Education President and Student Voice Coordinator.
- Attend and support Academic Representation Steering Group meetings to discuss ongoing course feedback in order to identify trends and close the feedback loop.
- Be available to meet regularly with Course Reps across their School or Faculty
- To maintain good relationships, and be in regular contact, with academics, students and the Students' Union.
- Attend monthly 1-2-1 meetings with the Student Voice Coordinator as well as regular Subject Chair Catch-Ups.
- To be an overall advocate, and promoter of wider SU events, campaigns, and democratic structures, including but not limited to Education Council and Members Meeting.
- To attend Educational Council Meetings, Big Rep Meetings and Members Meetings.

- You'll receive a comprehensive training package to ensure you feel supported and prepared for the year ahead, with the option of additional training sessions for personal development
